

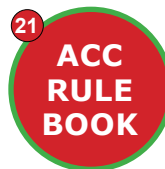

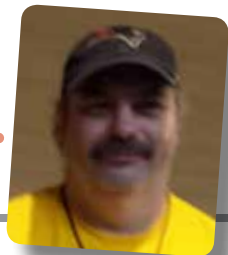

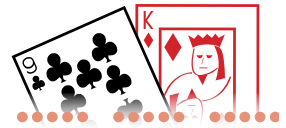
In closing, I just want to wish you all a wonderful Thanksgiving. And I personally hope that by the time you read this the Red Sox will have won the World Series! **CW**

Because Roman did not play games 6–8, these games do not count on his scorecard; so he basically qualified #52 in the main tourney by playing only 18½ games!

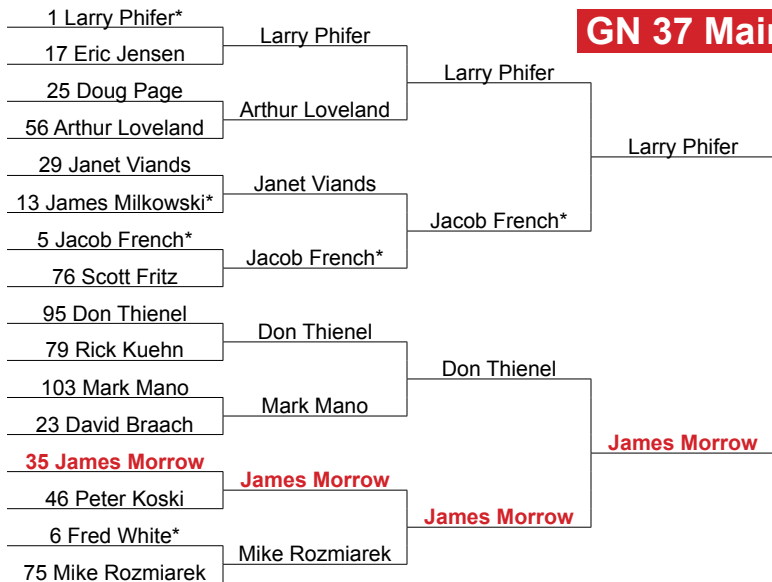

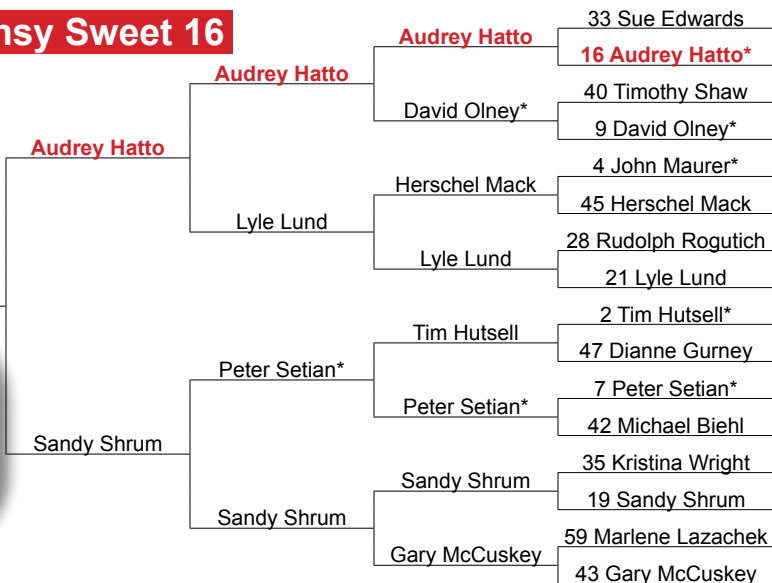

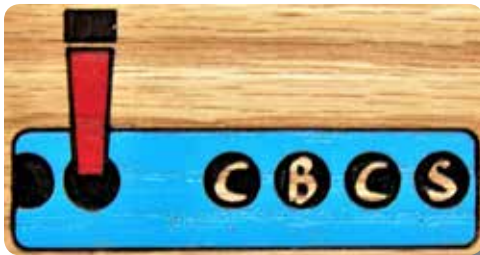

ACC Rulebook

Effective immediately, two rule changes were approved by the BOD in Milwaukee.

Rule 8.5b

This rule used to read that the score being recorded was forfeited after returning the pegs to the board. This was deemed too harsh a penalty for something that almost always occurs by accident. Rule 8.5b has been reworded. As a result, rule 8.7 is now deleted, and rules 8.8–8.11 are renumbered as 8.7–8.10.

b. If a player removes both pegs when there is a score to be recorded, players shall determine where the front peg should be placed. If the players cannot agree on the placement of the front peg, judges shall be summoned to decide the matter. Once the judges have determined placement of the front peg, the score of the hand may be pegged without penalty.

Rule 9.2d

This rule used to read that the pone needed to verbally accept the score. Now the pone must object if the count of the crib is wrong. The lack of an objection is considered acceptance. Rule 9.2d has been reworded.

d. Finally, the dealer exposes the crib, counts it, announces the score, and pegs it. Absent any verbal or other action of disapproval of the count by the pone, dealer shall place the crib and remaining cards face up on pone's side of the board for shuffling and subsequent deal.

25 Years Ago in the ACC

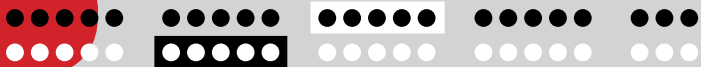
The cover of the November 1993 *Cribbage World* announced that **Rose Chase** (North Kingstown RI) topped the 188-player field at the Massachusetts Open.

The Inside Track

by Rob Medeiros



How many times do you have first count needing 10 and fall just short with an 8-point hand? Or watch your opponent just barely go out before you can count your 12-point hand? Maybe you can't avoid these outcomes, but it's just as likely you could/should have won these games.

Tip #3.1: understanding fourth street position and knowing whether offensive or defensive pegging is called for. This is a crucial element to playing winning cribbage. I discuss this tip in two columns, with the nondealer in hole 92 both times, but with the dealer in different positions. The crucial element is how the pegging sequences should differ.

In the first scenario, the nondealer and dealer are tied at hole 92. Before you—the nondealer—even pick up your cards the only word on your mind should be *defense*. Looking at A-2-6-8-10-K, you discard 10-K and cut a Queen. What now?

Obviously a 2-point hand is not ideal here, but we have to adapt to every situation. It is much more important to keep the dealer down than for you to try to peg a few extra points. You can always be more aggressive on your next deal if the need arises. The dealer has a three-hand advantage right now, so you have to wrest that control from the

dealer with ultra-defensive play. Lead the Ace and hope the dealer doesn't match it. If the dealer plays a Jack, Queen, or King, you can dump your 8 and possibly get 31-2 on the next play. If the dealer plays a picture card, this greatly reduces the chance of a good crib. If the dealer has a 16-point hand, there is nothing that you can do to stop it; but always try to give yourself a chance by playing defense on fourth street when necessary.

Next month's tip: offensive pegging on fourth street.

ACC Cribbage Code of Congeniality

During a new player's trial period (four weeks or until they earn points—whichever is longer) . . .

- We pledge to welcome new players warmly and make them feel wanted.
- We pledge to not penalize new players for violating tournament rules. (We will, instead, gently tell them what the rule is and what the penalty would be.)
- We pledge to not let new players underpeg points or undercount hands. (We will, instead, explain errors and then allow new players to take all points they are entitled to.)
- We pledge to not make new players feel inferior if/when they miss points or make a bad play. (We will, instead, let them know that all cribbage players do this and that it is part of the learning process.)
- We pledge to not force new players to play a game in fifteen minutes. (We will, instead, be tolerant and not complain, remembering that we, too, started slow.)
- We pledge to allow new players to play for free or at the minimum cost of club expenses.

After the trial period is up . . .

- We pledge to continue to make all players—new and existing—feel welcome and comfortable at our club.

Ruling Points . . .

It's all in the timing, they say, and good reasoning comes with knowledge of not only *if* but *when* to call a judge. For example, player A goes to score a pair, picks up front peg, puts it back where it was, scores the 2 points, and play continues. When player B is done playing and counting their hand, player B says, “Hey you picked up your front peg.” Unfortunately, no matter how correct they are in the remembering of the incident, it is too late to make any correction. The time to call a judge is before any other cribbage action takes place—period. Hopefully players don't try to play quickly on the chance of a mistake getting by their opponent, but they are out there. Taking the time to look at the pegging and calling out an infraction in a timely manner is just good cribbage mechanics.

Washington State Fair Promotion

The Washington State Fair in Puyallup WA is a weeks-long affair that attracts more than one million visitors every September. For nearly a quarter century, the ACC has had a presence at the fair through the volunteer work of hundreds of Grass Roots club members, coordinated for many years by Elmer "Ras" Rasmussen (Chehalis) and now by Don Zeuschel (Puyallup).

By the final day of

the fair on September 23, over 1,200 cribbage pamphlets and back issues of *Cribbage World* had been handed out, and hundreds of cribbage games had been played with fairgoers eager to beat the ACC's best!

Next year is the twenty-fifth year of the cribbage booth at the fair, so look for an even bigger ACC presence for next September. The future of ACC cribbage in the Pacific Northwest is strong!



The inaugural New England All Star Tournament was held on August 17 in conjunction with the resurrected New England Peer Tournament in Sturbridge MA. According to NEAST director **Jerome Kelliher** (at left in picture), the top four players were invited from each New England Grass Roots club, based on GRPs in the 2017–18 season. Nine of the twelve New England clubs sent players, from five states: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Rhode Island.

Each player played their counterpart from each club (that is, all the #1s played each other, all the #2s, and so on). Team points were then consolidated, and the top four teams went into playoffs.

The highest scoring team in the qualifying round was Club 72 (Longmeadow MA), which faced off against Hartford Metro Club 26 (East Hartford CT) in the

playoffs. The other semifinal match saw Stone Street Players Club 161 (Bellingham MA) taking on Casco Bay Crib Club 375 (Westbrook ME).

The honors go to Casco Bay, comprised of **Lance Browne**, **Don Miller**, **Donald Thompson**, and **Granville (Dick) Brown**. Facing them in the finals was a tough team from Hartford Metro, comprised of **Mike Fetchel**, **Greg Delaney**, **Marty Duchow**, and **Carl Deyette**. The championship literally wasn't decided until the last hand of the last game!

This tournament is similar to the Michigan All Star Tournament started by **David Aiken** in 2005 and exported to Florida in 2008 by the late **Ray Wanke**. This may be a type of tournament that other regions or states could start, as it brought to a weekend tournament some Grass Roots players who normally do not play weekend tournaments. While there are no points to be gained, there are definitely bragging rights for the best club in the area!



Cross-Check Satellite Scorecards

At the ACC's annual meeting in Milwaukee, the BOD voted—effective immediately—that scorecards for *all* satellite tournaments must be cross-checked. For small satellites, this requires cross-checking only a handful of scorecards and won't significantly impact a tournament director's time. For large satellites, to quote Western Region Tournament Commissioner **Rick Shea**, who sponsored this proposal, "there's too much money at stake to not cross-check."

MAST #14

The fourteenth annual Michigan All Star Tournament was held in Grand Rapids on September 8. This tourney featured the top four players according to batting average from eight Michigan Grass Roots clubs. With a 28-game format (i.e., each club played all four members of the seven opposing clubs), this became a battle of both skill and endurance.

The top team this year was Club 329 from Mount Pleasant MI, which also won this event in 2011. Led by team captain **Phillip Whitehouse**, Club 329 posted a

combined score of 133/66, drawing on the talents of **Doug Brackemyre**, **Richard Dominick**, and **Larry Collins**.

The top scorecard of the tourney was turned in by **Doug Brackemyre** (44/21 +183), followed by **Andy Stireman** (Club 432) in second place with 40/19 +208 and **Dan McAlary** (Club 71) in third place with 35/17 +156.

Other participating clubs were Grand Rapids #71, Muskegon #229, Battle Creek #300, Kalamazoo #321, Jackson #332, Bergland #390, and Traverse City #432.



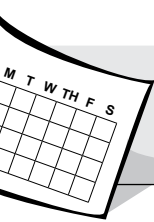
