## Counting 15s

I don't know whether other cribbage players already know this, but I've found a clever way to doublecheck the 15 s in my hand. I add up all the cards and then figure out what has to be subtracted from that total to reach 15 . For example, 2-3-$4-5-8$ add to 22 , which means I have to subtract 7 to get to 15 . The cards that add to 7 are 3-4 and 2-5, which means I have two 15 s , which is consistent with what I get when I counting 15 s in the usual way (3-4-8 and 2-5-8). This method is a great way to make sure you count all of the 15 s you're entitled to.

Editor's note: this time-tested method for confirming 15 s works best when the cards total between 16 to 25 (e.g., A-2-3-4-6 = 16, and there is only one way to drop a single point-thus 15-2 plus a run of four).

## Play smart, play fair, play fast-but mostly play nice

Am I the only one noticing that players seem to be whining more nowadays?

I don't mean legitimate whining, you know, when you are dealing on first street and looking at A-2-6-7-10-K in your hand

14 points, or the great board position. Could the cut have been better? Perhaps. But how about applying something here we should've learned in kindergarten: appreciating what we have instead of whining about what we don't have.

Cribbage players have so much to be thankful for-mainly that we get

We should also be thankful for the freedom to travel freely in this country and visit friends and scenic locales while attending cribbage tournaments. And thankful for the discretionary income that allows us to afford this. In other words: if we spend all day playing cribbage, then we have no right to whine about a few lousy points.

Of course, this is not a one-way street, as I have been known to whine from time to time. So next time I whine about the lack of a cut to my 12-hand, feel free to whip out this page and remind me of what I wrote here. CW

## CAPTAIN CRIBBAGE

Sooner or later, everyone finds themselves in a room with three people who want to play cribbage. Rather than one player sitting out while the other two get to have all the fun, "Captain Cribbage" was invented! Standard cribbage rules apply, with these exceptions.

One player ("the captain") plays against two players ("the crew"). The captain has to go only 61 holes, while the crew has to travel the standard 121 holes. The captain deals first in each game, and the deals passes to her/his left on subsequent hands until the game is finished.

Each player gets five cards, with an extra card being dealt into the crib. Each player discards one card into the crib. If the dealer forgets to deal a card to the crib, the top card from the card stock is added to the crib to make a full complement in the crib.

The crew, of course, starts with their pegs in hole 0 . The starting position for the captain's pegs can be either hole 0 (in which case the captain goes up first street and then turns immediately onto fourth street) or hole 60 (in which case the captain covers third and fourth streets only).

As in standard cribbage, skunks are counted as hole 90 or greater for the crew. The captain is skunked, however, if she/he doesn't get to at least hole 46 .

To make things fair, it is common to play Captain Cribbage in sets of three games, with each player taking her/his turn as the captain. OW

## The Inside Track <br> by Rob Medeiros <br> -०००० ००० -0000

Many players ask me how to become a better player. I've talked about this in the past but want to spend some time discussing three specific tips.

Tip \#1: the easiest way to improve your game is to remember what two cards you discarded-every hand. Knowledge is power, and if you know two extra cards that are out of pegging play and that your opponent doesn't know, it can only be to your benefit. Cribbage is a game of percentages, and defensive pegging in particular is greatly aided in crunching all the numbers. Don't worry though, as it's not as complicated as it sounds!

Let's use this hand as an example. It's your crib, so you keep 6-7-8-9 and discard 5-5 (don't forget to raise your hand!). It is early in the game so position is not that vital. Your opponent leads a 3; what do you play? Under normal circumstances-or not having any idea what is in my crib-I would play the 9 and hope my opponent didn't lead from a pair of 3 s . However, armed with my knowledge of my double 5 discard, I will play the 7 and guard against the two remaining 5 s rather than the three remaining 3 s . Over the long haul you will have a decided advantage with this extra data.

Next month's tip: Always have a plan in mind before the cut card is revealed.

- We pledge to not force new players to play a game in fifteen minutes. (We will, instead, be tolerant and not complain, remembering that we, too, started slow.)
- We pledge to allow new players to play for free or at the minimum cost of club expenses.

## Youth Yeaching rip

The most difficult concept to grasp as a new cribbage player is the strategy of exposing your cards during the pegging process. When working one-on-one or with a small group, you may want to try the following teaching approach when first starting out. Deal out four cards and practice laying down your cards. This way you can help your student(s) not play into runs and when to say "go." You can cover rules such as having to play all your cards before claiming the point for "go" and how to restart a sequence to 31 . These basic parts of the game can be confusing to a newcomer. I usually open my first few lessons with four or five hands of this, and then move on to how to play with a standard six-card deal. This teaching strategy avoids overwhelming new players (especially youth) by all the different aspects of the game. If a young person gets a sense that the game may be too difficult to learn, you've most likely lost them.

He scored 50 GRPs in the GRRT and GRNT to Mel's zero. Wilson caught the grizzled veteran on week 33 , lost it on week 34 , took it back on week 35 , and secured it with more points on week 36 ! Considering that Wilson is also doing well earning MRPs at weekend ACC tournaments this year, we can no longer call him an "upstart-newbie"!
Sandy Sands writes: "My dad, Bill Sands, passed in 2000, but he taught me cribbage at an early age. We often gathered at the Wing Ranch (see picture below) with uncles, aunts, and cousins, where we couldn't wait until we were old enough to learn cribbage at one of several card tables set up in the living room. My dad was champion at Helena Club 25 and winner of
 one sanctioned tourney. I have been fortunate to follow in his footsteps decades later, securing club championships in 2007 and 2008. He was my inspiration in cribbage, but even more so, in life!"
